However, the editors have asked you to write your own biography and it <u>MUST</u> be a poem of <u>EXACTLY</u> 30 words... no more, no less.


What 30 words best describe you and your life?
What 30 words only describe you and your unique personality and talents?
What makes you different from everyone else?

#### Your Jask:

- Brainstorm as many words as you can to describe yourself—hobbies, quirks, abilities, personality traits (messy, neat, moody, picky, artistic, sporty), family, likes /dislikes...
- Write your poem using exactly 30 words.
- <u>Display</u> your poem in the form of a small <u>poster with pictures and symbols</u> that represent your unique qualities and abilities
- Pictures can be hand drawn, from a magazine or from the internet, however they must symbolize you.
- Don't forget to check for spelling and grammar errors.
- Be creative. Really dig deep into who YOU are as a person!

#### Grading Criteria

- Your poem must be exactly 30 words.
- Your poem should flow smoothly rather than just be a list of 30 words.
- Includes pictures and symbols to represent you and your unique personality.
- Please do not hand this assignment in if it is incomplete.



#### Finalizing Your Poem

Look over your brainstorming worksheet and pick out the words and ideas that you think MOST represent you and your unique personality and qualities. You can only use 30 words, so pick your words carefully.

#### Helpful Hints

- Avoid just listing your favorite 30 things or 30 character traits.
  - Add words and ideas to help your poem flow smoothly.
- If you can't fit all of your ideas into your poem, think about how you could represent those ideas on your poster visually.
  - Be creative and use descriptive words.

#### **EXAMPLE POEMS**

You can write your poem in <u>3rd person</u>. (As if someone else is writing it about you.) Here's an example:

#### **Mason**

Fiery trouble maker who torments his sister and frustrates his parents. He craves chocolate ice cream, pizza, and salty popcorn. Lives for retro video games and fishing with his buddies.

Or you can write it in <u>1st person.</u> (From your own perspective.) Here's an example:

#### <u>Jacinta</u>

I am a Spanish speaking, hamburger loving sister and daughter.
I dream of Paris, bungee jumping and become a nurse.
Fast reader, expert "texter", loud laugher, story teller and athlete.
